## Chappy's chat....

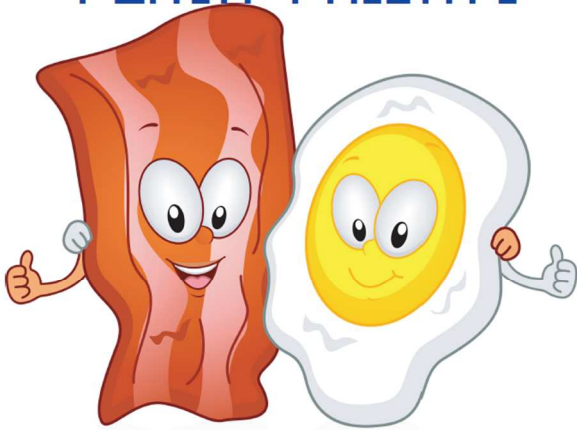
What a great first Term it has been! I am excited and looking forward to what Term 2 is going to bring.
