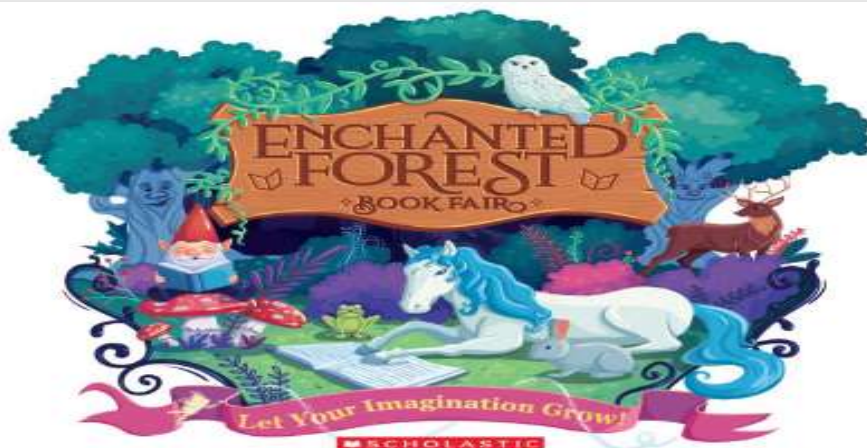

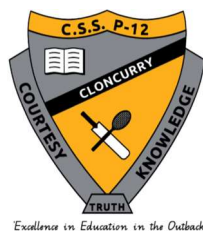
Special Events:
